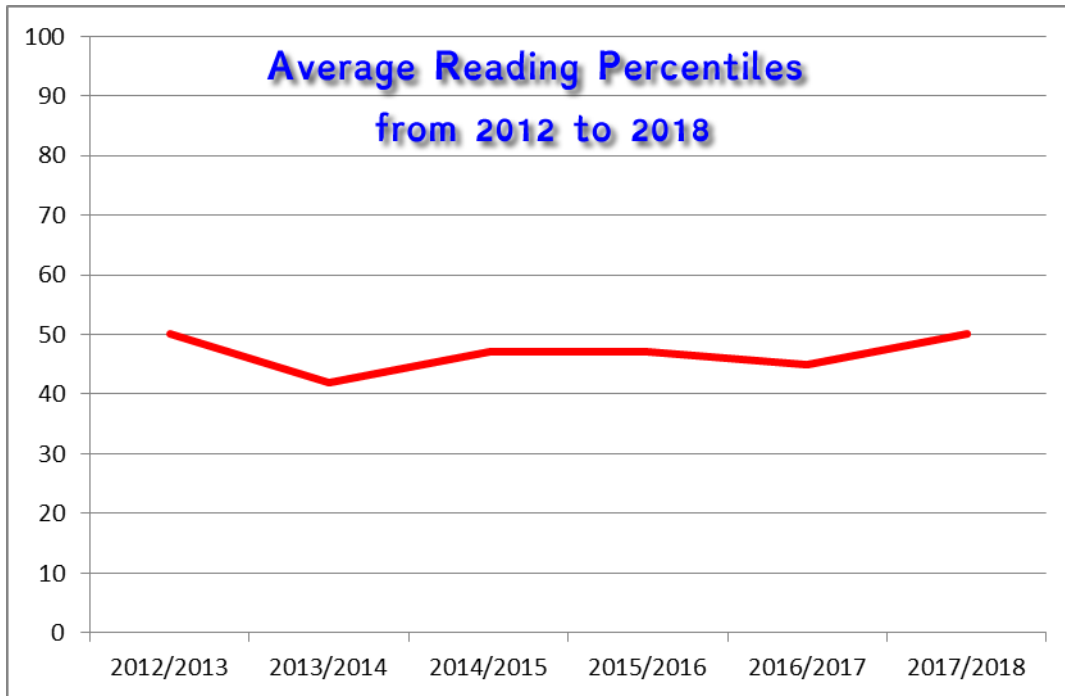
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School Improvement Plan for Literacy 2018/2019



Average Percentile Reading Scores 2012 - 2018

For 2018/2019 There will be a designated person in the Junior Homework Club (Third & fourth Classes) who will listen to reading each day the homework Club operates to try to ensure that all targeted pupils are listened to reading.

Targets for 2018/2019:

Group 1:

Infants: To increase success in literacy of pupils in Junior & Senior Infant Classes

Measures:

- ✓ Every lesson will have clearly defined literacy or numeracy content.
- ✓ Significant Reduction in the Pupil Teacher Ratio in Infants (Classes of 16 & 18 in Junior Infants, 12 and 14 in Senior Infants)
- ✓ Full implementation of the New Primary Language Curriculum – Starlight Programme & Reading Zone
- ✓ Full implementation of the Aistear Framework
- ✓ Full implementation of the First Steps Programme
- ✓ Reading Eggs for Junior & Senior Infants (TY Students to set up Computer Room on Fridays and parents to be given usernames and login details for pupils for use at home)
- ✓ Literacy Lift-Off for Senior Infants after Christmas (testing of pupils will be done the first week back after Christmas)

Group 8:

3 Pupils at the 99th percentile band (Second Class: 0, Third Class: 1, Fourth Class: 0, Fifth Class: 1 and Sixth Class: 1)

To maintain these pupils at the 99th percentile and raise another 3 pupils to the level.

Measures:

- ✓ School Library – ensure that pupils read all ten of the **10 Top Books from our School Library for 9 years – 12 years** and all ten books from the **12 years + Recommended Reading List** as appropriate
- ✓ Publication of pupils' compositions in book called "Reflections on the Famine" with poetry, prose, letters, diary entries, art etc from Sixth Class pupils
- ✓ Participation in the "To Be Continued" series where pupils write endings to a story for publication

Additional Measures:

- **Secret Reader:** HSCL to organise from infants to first class "Guess who is coming in to read?" Parent to come in and read to children – second term.
- **Reading Buddies:** Infants to Second Class – May & June 2019 (Fifth & Sixth Class pupils reading to younger pupils – using the wide resources available on Twinkl.
- Classes to go to the **local library** as much as possible
- Reading by teacher to class using books from the recommended reading list in the school library.

- New staff to get “Building Bridges of Understanding” and other resources as required. Literacy co-ordinator to arrange.
- Designated person in Junior Homework Club to listen to reading each day
